The 2010 Summer Institute provides participants with the opportunity to learn about the Holocaust by interweaving study of this dark hour in human history with eyewitness accounts by Holocaust survivors. Through scholarly lectures, personal recollections, guided discussions, films, readings and handout materials, participants will learn the history of the Holocaust and develop age-appropriate strategies for teaching this difficult subject. We are committed to assisting and preparing teachers to teach about the Holocaust in both language arts and history classrooms.

Texts for the course include *The World Must Know* by Michael Berenbaum, *Tell Them We Remember* by Susan D. Bachrach and at least one of the following: *Number the Stars* by Lois Lowry, *The Diary of a Young Girl* by Anne Frank, and/or *Night* by Elie Wiesel. Registrants receive a 15% discount on these books at the Breman Museum Shop.

The course includes:

- Lectures by college professors and master teachers
- Eyewitness accounts by Holocaust survivors
- Guided tour of the Breman's signature gallery, *Absence of Humanity: The Holocaust Years, 1933–1945*
- Sharing and planning classroom applications
- Introduction to music and art of the Holocaust
- Teacher materials for classroom use

The Weinberg Center for Holocaust Education includes an extensive Holocaust library, a video lending-library, curriculum materials and consultation with Breman Museum staff.

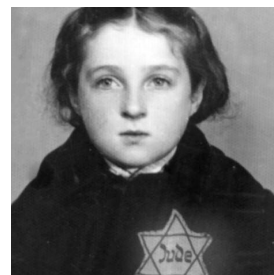
