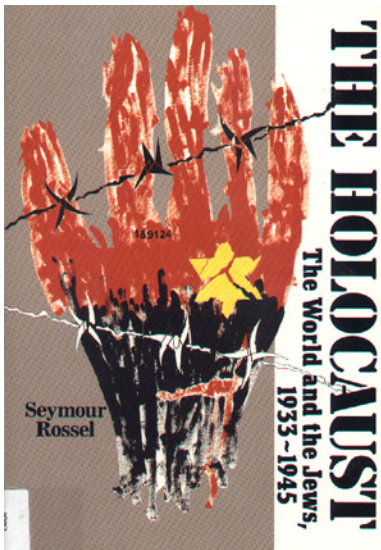

SUBJECT: Holocaust—General History; Tolerance; Prejudice

TITLE: The Holocaust: The World and the Jews, 1933-1945 (Seymour Rossel)

This book is non-fiction and provides a good, young adult-friendly overview of the Holocaust. The chapters include the subjects of the roots of anti-Semitism, the rise of the Nazi party, ghettoization, the Einsatzgruppen, other victims, deportations and the camps, resistance, the Allies, rescuers and Righteous Gentiles, and finally the issue of justice after the war. The pictures are pertinent but generally restrained.

TYPE: General non-fiction

GRADE LEVEL: Middle school in general

- 1 BOOK The Holocaust: The World and the Jews, 1933-1945 (Seymour Rossel) MN 70032 This book can be combined in its entirety or any portion with the video and lesson plan. Each chapter has review questions and discussion questions on that particular topic.



- 1 VIDEO Prejudice and Hate 1134V2 (Georgia State Holocaust Commission) This video includes local Holocaust survivors and Atlanta news, sports, political, and religious figures discussing the results of prejudice and hate and the rise of neo-Nazism here in Georgia. The teacher should preview the video because the images are graphic. Overall it tends to be a little dry.

- 1 LESSON PLAN A Study Guide to the Holocaust. This lesson plan is weak on the history (where the book excels) but it has good instructional materials and student exercises on the “Hangman” poem. It also includes some teacher’s resources and additional materials listings.
