The Standard Club is the outgrowth of the Concordia Club, which was established in 1867, as Atlanta's first Jewish social club. Originally located on the third floor of a building on the corner of Forsyth and Marietta Streets, the Standard Club would move five times in the succeeding decades. It is presently located on beautiful grounds in Roswell, Georgia.

For over 100 years the Standard Club met most of the social needs of its many members. In the early years, the club adhered to a closed membership policy, welcoming primarily those from the well-established German Jewish community to join. This policy, in part, led to the establishment of social organizations such as the Progressive Club and the Mayfair Club, which met the needs of other segments of Atlanta's Jewish society. The history of the Standard Club directly mirrors the history and lifestyle of its members whose social, political, economic, and philanthropic contributions have helped to shape the city of Atlanta.

The Standard Club Records, 1850-1982, are composed primarily of records relating to the land and financial transactions necessary for the club's move in 1922 to the William C. Sanders mansion on Washington Street and for the club's purchase in 1929, of a lot at 400 Ponce de Leon Avenue. The historian interested in the social life of Atlanta's pioneering German Jewish community will find this collection of special interest. The collection is arranged alphabetically by subject and chronologically within each folder.
