My dear Senator George:

This is further in reply to your letter of February 18, 1935, the receipt of which has heretofore been acknowledged relative to the claim of Mrs. Sadie Goldstein Gordon, 1102 St. Charles Pl. N.E., Atlanta, Georgia, for property said to have been taken from her parents, Rosa and Samuel Goldstein, owners of a dry goods store during the War with Spain, in Macon, Georgia.

The records show that a claim in favor of R. Goldstein (not found as S. or Samuel Goldstein) for damages to property by the 2nd Ohio U. S. Volunteers, War with Spain, amounting to \$347.39, was presented February 28, 1899. A search of the records was made and the claimant was informed that the records afford no information in relation to the appropriation of the property of R. Goldstein by the 2nd Ohio Volunteers, as alleged.

A further search of the records in this Department has been made but nothing has been found of the appropriation of the property of Mr. and Mrs. Goldstein. Nor has the War Department any fund from which reimbursement can be made in claims of this nature.

The inclosure received with your letter is herewith returned.
